Mission Accomplished Stable Housing

In addition to providing the core services of Volunteer Behavioral Health, special grant-funded programs are developed to serve those who are most vulnerable in our communities. One of these programs is M.A.S.H. which provides supportive services to very low-income veteran families who are at risk of homelessness or who are homeless. This Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) grant allows us to assist very low income veteran families by providing a range of supportive services designed to promote housing stability. M.A.S.H. proudly serves: Bledsoe, Bradley, Cannon, Clay, Cumberland, DeKalb, Fentress, Franklin, Grundy, Hamilton, Jackson, Macon, Marion, McMinn, Meigs, Overton, Pickett, Polk, Putnam, Rhea, Sequatchie, Smith, Van Buren, Warren, White and Wilson Counties.



How We Helped

- \$ 15,518.00 rental assistance and security deposits
- \$1,078.00 utilities and utility deposits
- \$505.07 for general housing stability assists, emergency housing assistance, and transportation.
- \$17,101.07 total for Category 1 & Category 2.

Highlights from May

- 29 participants were screened and 18 were enrolled.
- On average, it took 2 days for a participant to be assigned to a CM.
- 4 participants were housed this month. It took an average of 11 days for these participants to receive housing.
- The area of service includes Bradley County, Cumberland County, Dekalb County, Franklin County, Grundy County, Hamilton County, Jackson County, Putman County, Warren County, White County, and Wilson County.
- 35 participants received TFA Funding.
